Face Coverings in Church: The NI Executive recently issued the following regulation concerning the wearing of face coverings during church services: *"The legal requirement to wear a face covering in a place of worship, during an act of worship, has been removed. However it is still strongly advised."* People entering and leaving the church MUST continue to wear face coverings. While the wearing of face coverings during the Mass is no longer a legal requirement, Fr Alwill strongly advises that people should, in the interests of health and safety, continue to wear masks throughout the Mass. Naturally, the coverings may be briefly removed in order to receive Holy Communion.

Growing up, did you hear any 'old wives' tales' about food - eating carrots helps you see in the dark; bread crusts will make your hair curly; an apple a day keeps the doctor away...? These wise old sayings, passed down the generations, were employed to encourage us to eat certain foods, mainly healthy fruit and veg. Many even had an element of truth. These days we can easily establish the accuracy of such claims, but many parents still find themselves falling back on these nuggets of wisdom.
