World Day of Migrants and Refugees

The Church has been celebrating the World Day of Migrants and Refugees since 1914. It's always an occasion to express concern for different vulnerable people on the move; to pray for them as they face many challenges; and to increase awareness about the opportunities that migration offers.



The theme of Pope Francis' message for the 110th World Day of Migrants and Refugees is: **God walks with His people**. In this message, the Holy Father reminds us that all of us, God's people, are migrants on this earth, on our way to the "true homeland", the Kingdom of Heaven. Migrants are a contemporary icon of this people on a journey, of the Church on a journey, and at the same time, it is in them and in all our vulnerable brothers and sisters that we can encounter the Lord who walks with us.

A Prayer for People on the Move

Jesus was always on the move, too,
stirring up dust on the roads, swaying to the swells of the sea.
I like to picture how far the wind has blown since then,
across these thousands of years and millions of miles,
carrying the dirt he tread upon all around the globe,
whisking the waves he sailed in to every corner of the world.
Migrants and refugees who seek new work, new homes,
carry with them, perhaps, a grain of sand that Jesus touched,
