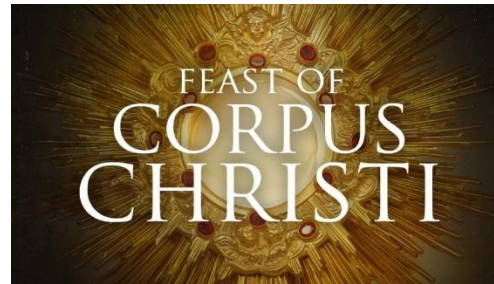

The Most Holy Body & Blood of Christ

The Feast of Corpus Christi, also known as the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, is a significant event in the Roman Catholic liturgical calendar. This day is dedicated to celebrating and honouring the Eucharist—the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ, present in the consecrated host and wine.

Origins and Celebration

The feast was instituted in the 13th century, inspired by visions of Saint Juliana of Liège, a Belgian nun who sought to have a day specifically dedicated to the Eucharist. Pope Urban IV officially established the Feast of Corpus Christi in 1264, setting a precedent for a tradition that spans centuries.

Why Is It Important?

The Feast of Corpus Christi is a manifestation of the deep reverence Catholics have for the Eucharist. It serves as a solemn reminder of the Last Supper, where Jesus instituted the sacrament of Holy Communion, commanding His disciples to continue the practice in memory of Him. This day underscores the belief in the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist, which is a cornerstone of Catholic faith.
