Weekend 1st & 2nd November 2025 All Souls Day

- **1.**We pray for our Pope, Leo, and for all the leaders of our church, that they may take their inspiration from Christ and become channels of God's mercy and forgiveness. Lord, hear us.
- 2. That those who inflict injury and hurt on the innocent through ignorance, fear or prejudice, may open their eyes to the error of their ways and so change their lives. Lord, hear us.
- 3.In November we traditionally remember our dead. Today we remember in a special way those who have died since this time last year. But today we also pray for those who are in mourning, for those whose hearts are broken by the pain of bereavement. May the Lord hear their prayers and fill them with his peace. Lord, hear us.
- **4.**We ask the Lord to send his blessing on those who are sick, and on all who are in need of his loving care. Lord, hear us.

Weekend 8th & 9th November 2025 The Dedication of the Lateran Basilica

- 1. We pray for our Church, that the faith of its members may shine as a light of hope in a world overshadowed by doubt, by fear and by war. Lord, hear us.
- 2. We pray for those who have no faith and who live without hope. May they come to know Christ and to believe in the eternal life he has promised. Lord, hear us.
