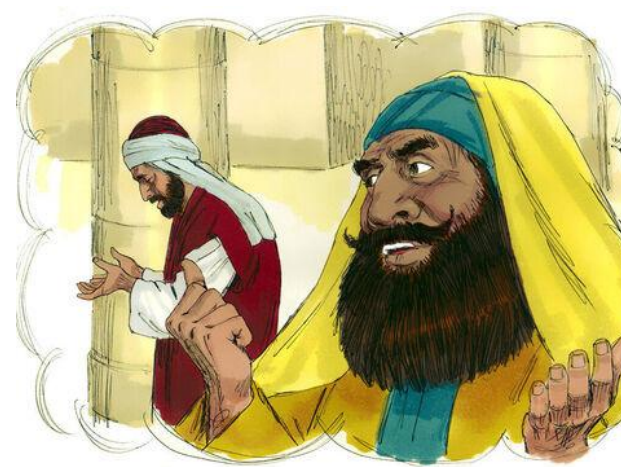

The parable in today's gospel is about 'keeping our eyes on our own plate' and not comparing ourselves to others, its very structure *invites* us to compare these two men.

It's so ironic that I have to wonder if it's intentional, to demonstrate just how prone we are to compare ourselves to others and to cast ourselves as the 'good guy'. There is really only ever one message attached to it, which is to *always* cast yourself in the role of the Pharisee. That way, you are always the one who needs to hear the message. There is a lot of wisdom in this. It is really the only way to avoid enacting the 'scapegoat mechanism', in which we point our fingers at 'the other' (whoever that may be for us) for all the world's ills.

Self-righteousness is an easy trap to fall into — one of the easiest. Our current social and political discourse is rife with it — finger pointing, distraction, 'but what about...', and 'at least we're not ...'. Today's Gospel is a reminder that this is a dead-end road, that leads only to contempt and hardening of hearts, and not to any kind of solution. Rather, we must always take the tax collector as our teacher, and point our fingers at ourselves, take responsibility for our part in the world's state, and pray, "God, be merciful to me, a sinner."
