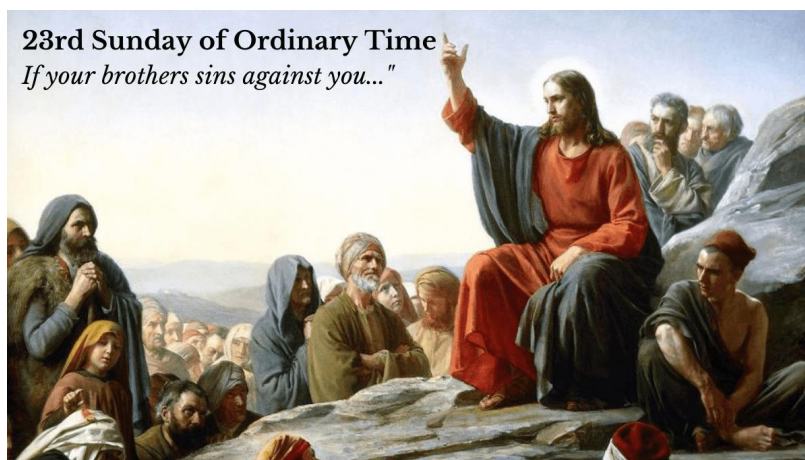


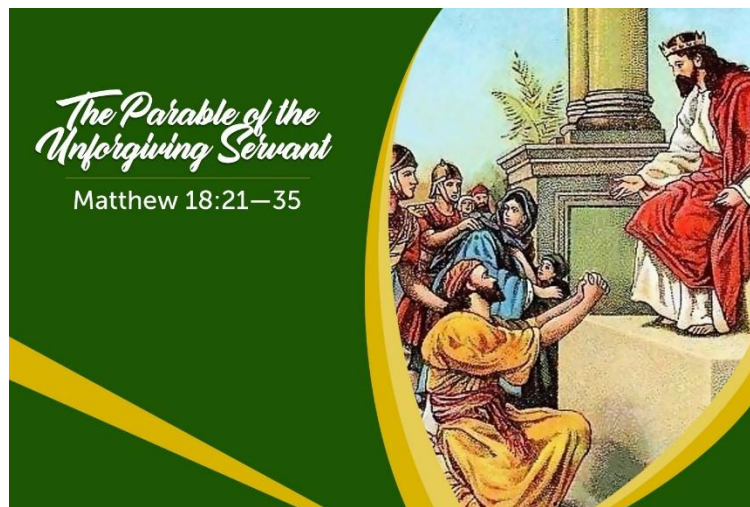
Prayer of the Faithful
